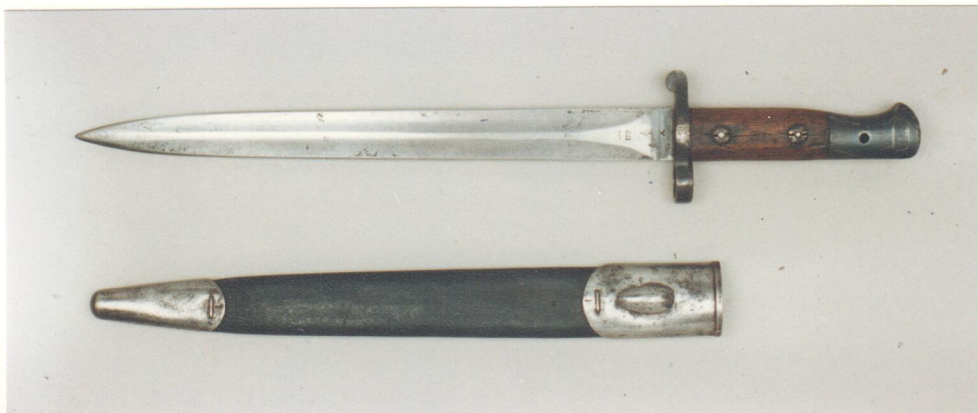

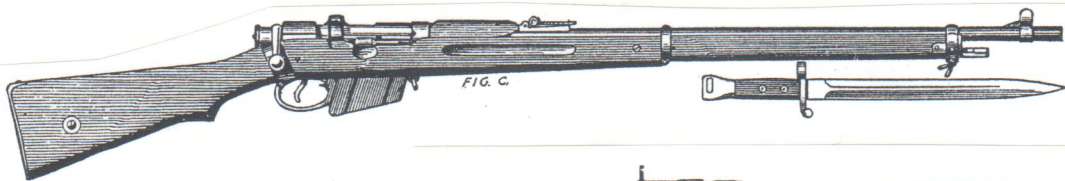
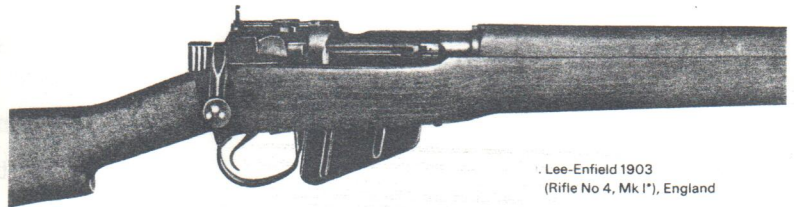


FIG. C. ENGLISH LEE-ENFIELD MAGAZINE RIFLE. Officially known as "Charge-Loader." Converted from early models of the long rifles, dated from 1889 to 1903. These guns are all 10 shot magazine and .303. A front sight guard has been added and an improved rear sight. The old short hand guard and old type bayonet have been retained. The gun (Fig. C) is a Lee-Metford (1892) converted.
There was also found among the captured arms, specimens of Lee-Metfords and Lee-Enfields, unchanged since their issue 1889-1899.)
