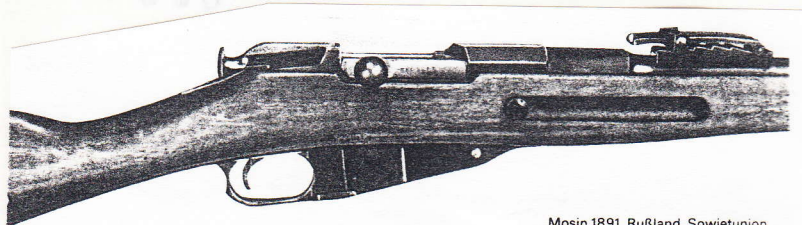

FIG. F. RUSSIAN MOUZIN MAGAZINE RIFLE. Model of 1901, officially known as the "3 line rifle," also "Nagant." Magazine is of the Lee type. The bayonet is fine old fashioned sleeve and fixed, no scabbard being provided. The "U" intended to be always carried these from manufacture being in this country for training purposes. No changes have been made in the weapon since its introduction twenty years ago. Also made without sling swivels, holes being bored in the stock for the purpose of carrying.
